RULES OF THE ROAD

§ 3112 (c) Inoperable or malfunctioning signal.--If a traffic-control signal is out of operation or is not functioning properly, vehicular traffic facing a:

- (1) Green or yellow signal may proceed with caution.
- (2) Red or completely unlighted signal shall stop in the same manner as at a stop sign, and the right to proceed shall be subject to the rules applicable after making a stop at a stop sign as provided in section 3323 (relating to stop signs and yield signs).

§ 3323(b) Duties at stop signs.--Except when directed to proceed by a police officer or appropriately attired persons authorized to direct, control or regulate traffic, every driver of a vehicle approaching a stop sign shall stop at a clearly marked stop line or, if no stop line is present, before entering a crosswalk on



the near side of the intersection or, if no crosswalk is present, then at the point nearest the intersecting roadway where the driver has a clear view of approaching traffic on the intersecting roadway before entering. If, after stopping at a crosswalk or clearly marked stop line, a driver does not have a clear view of approaching traffic, the driver shall after yielding the right-of-way to any pedestrian in the crosswalk slowly pull forward from the stopped position to a point where the driver has a clear view of approaching traffic. The driver shall yield the right-of-way to any

vehicle in the intersection or approaching on another roadway so closely as to constitute a hazard during the time when the driver is moving across or within the intersection or junction of roadways and enter the intersection when it is safe to do so.

PREVENTING LITTER



Littering is a serious problem in Shaler Township. We need to work together to prevent litter because randomly discarded trash, even items as small as cigarette butts, endangers our environment, our wildlife and our economy.

As Shaler residents, we can't afford the cost of littering because it pollutes our "back yards", it decreases our property values, and cleaning it up wastes our tax dollars. Littering can also result in costly fines for litter law violators. Much of the litter in the township is the result of trash being thrown out of cars.

You can help! If you see someone throwing materials out of a vehicle, get the license number, the time and location that it took place and call the Police Department at 412.492.2222. They will file a citation against the owner of the vehicle. You will have to provide testimony at the magistrate's hearing but this is a small sacrifice to pay for helping to keep Shaler Township clean and attractive.

TRASH AND RECYCLING LAW

Trash and recycling cans should not be placed at the curb until 6:00 p.m. the evening before your pick up day. Trash and recycling cans should not be stored at the curb or in the front yard.



LEAF - YARD WASTE COLLECTION

October, November, December

Leaf - Yard Waste Collection: During leaf collection for October through December there is no need to schedule as the entire community will be serviced for leaf and yard waste collection on the dates below:

- Yard waste includes: leaves, garden residue, shrubbery with no dirt attached, limbs, twigs, brush and tree trimmings, and similar items, but does not include grass clippings.
- Yard waste must be placed in a bio-degradable paper bag. Tree trimmings not to exceed 3 inches in diameter, brush, limbs, twigs and shrubbery must be bundled in lengths not to exceed 4 feet.


HHW includes: (5gallons or less):

Paint – latex or oil-based, Light bulbs – fluorescents, compact fluorescents, Paint thinners, gasoline, solvents, Discharge (HID) lamps, Oil, petroleum-based lubricants, Batteries – lead acid, alkaline and nicad, Ethylene glycol, antifreeze, Pool chemicals, Pesticides, herbicides, Cleaners – acidic and basic, Aerosols, Resins and epoxy, Mercury and mercury debris

E-Waste includes: TV's, computers, monitors, VCR and DVD players, printers, fax machines, cable boxes, gaming equipment and similar electronic waste.

Cardboard Recycling: If you have oversized cardboard that does not fit into your recycling cart, the cardboard may be placed in the recycling dumpster at the Shaler Township Municipal Building parking lot. Please break the cardboard down to lay flat when placing in the Recycling Dumpster.
