KIWANIS PARK - FALL RUN PARK CRAWFORD POOL IMPROVEMENTS

The spring of 2015 has been very busy and many projects have been completed in anticipation of the opening of Crawford Pool in Kiwanis Park. Over the past several years, the board of commissioners have committed capital funds to the continued improvement of this premier park in the township.



Pool Improvements:

In continuing the improvements at the pool that began in 2014, we have recently re-grouted and caulked all seams in the pool and replaced the spalling concrete on several areas of the pool walls. The

contract for this work was in excess of \$25,950. The re-grouting was necessary due to a number of large water leaks that were discovered in 2014. These leaks occurred over a period of time and re-grouting, sealing and replacing concrete were essential to preserving the infrastructure of the pool. The public works crew will also repaint the pool prior to opening.

Utility Replacements: In anticipation of paving the Kiwanis Park access roads and parking lots, the township replaced the gas and water service lines under the parking lot. Both of these lines were installed during the original construction of the pool in 1964. The gas service line was replaced at a contracted price of \$16,350.

The Shaler Township public works crew, in conjunction with the Hampton Shaler Water Authority replaced the water service line utilizing in house forces.

Park Paving: The Shaler Township Board of Commissioners awarded a paving contract to Shields Paving, Inc. in the amount of \$243,535 for repaving all access roads and parking lots in Kiwanis Park and Fall Run Park. This work was performed in May. This is the largest park paving contract awarded in the history of Shaler Township.

Sanitary Sewer Line: In 2014, it was discovered that the sanitary sewer line servicing the concession stand was failing resulting in sanitary sewer backups along the line. The public works crew excavated the line and replaced it with new piping, providing adequate fall for proper drainage. An access point was also installed to allow crews to maintain the line on a routine basis to prevent future issues.

Pool Additions: A new addition to Crawford Pool is the installation of a family changing/shower room. This new addition will allow parents or guardians to utilize shower and restroom facilities with smaller children. Rules for use of the family room will be posted at the pool for the summer season. The final improvements for 2015 include the installation of a new "sunbrella" for increased shade and the purchase of more lawn chairs for use by the adult patrons.

HAMPTON SHALER WATER AUTHORITY (HSWA) RATES THE BEST DEAL AROUND

Recently, there have been quite a few stories in the news and on TV about the rising costs of both sanitary sewer and drinking water rates. You may have quickly glanced at your own bill from HSWA and thought that your HSWA water rates have gone up, too. That just is not the case.

As a convenience to our customers, the authority provides sewer billing services to many of the municipalities in which we provide public water service. Among those which we provide this service are Shaler Township, Hampton Township, Etna Borough, Indiana

Shown below is a sample HSWA bill:

“Water Consumption” billing is calculated in thousands of gallons, in this example this home used 9,000 gallons of water in this two month billing period. Their \$33.93 is the extension of \$3.77/1,000 gallons for usage of 9,000 gallons. The \$15.00 “Water Service Charge” is a base rate applied to each residential home every two months. The “Sewer Consumption” line of \$18.00 (at a rate of \$2/1,000 gallons) goes to Shaler Township for their sanitary sewer operations and maintenance, along with a similar base charge of \$6.32. Finally, the “ALCOSAN Consumption” charge of \$47.97 is a pass-through rate of \$5.33/1,000 gallons that goes

Township, McCandless Township, O’Hara Township, ALCOSAN and Girty’s Run Sewer Authority. These townships and sanitary authorities control their own sewer rates and many have had significant rate increases over the past three years. For example, ALCOSAN has a 37% rate increase in the last three years. Shaler Township sewer rates have not changed since 2012 when a 10 cent per thousand gallon increase was adopted. HSWA bills sewer services for these municipalities and sanitary authorities and remits the revenue back to the respective agency.

directly to ALCOSAN, there is also a charge of \$7.47 that is included in the amount remitted to ALCOSAN.

When the Shaler Water Department and the Hampton Township Municipal Authority merged into the Hampton Shaler Water Authority on January 1, 2012, the Authority’s Board of Directors adopted the Shaler Water rate structure. This rate was established by the Shaler Township Board of Commissioners on January 1, 2008 and is still the water rate today.

How many utilities or places of business can boast that their rates have not gone up for seven years? HSWA has the lowest water rates in southwestern Pennsylvania as illustrated below.

When the merger occurred, the Authority’s Board of Directors worked diligently to eliminate redundant costs and maximize the efficiency of the organization. The main reason for the success of the authority is our excellent group of employees that are strongly dedicated to improving the overall operation of HSWA – from our distribution crew that repairs water breaks in the dead of winter and replaces 1.25 miles of pipe year-round, to our water plant personnel that pump and treat 5 to 6 million gallons of water a day from our underground aquifer, to our service crew that reads

meters and marks One Calls for upcoming construction projects, to our attentive and customer-friendly customer service staff at the office.

Although the authority will likely have to raise rates sometime in the future, rest assured the board of directors and staff are committed to keeping them as low as possible, while still providing you the same high level of service that you have come to expect from your water authority!

RULES OF THE ROAD

Texting While Driving

A state law, effective March 8, 2012, prohibits as a primary offense any driver from using an Interactive Wireless Communication Device (IWCD) to send, read or write a text-based communication while his or her vehicle is in motion.

The law also:

- Defines an IWCD as a wireless phone, personal digital assistant, smart phone, portable or mobile computer or similar devices that can be used for texting, instant messaging, emailing or browsing the internet.
- Defines a text-based communication as a text message, instant message, email or other written communication composed or received on an IWCD.
- Institutes a \$50 fine for convictions under this section.
- Makes clear that this law supersedes and preempts any local ordinances restricting the use of interactive wireless devices by drivers.

The penalty is a summary offense. The law does not authorize the seizure of an IWCD. The texting ban does not include the use of a GPS device, a system or device that is physically or electronically integrated into the vehicle, or a communications device that is affixed to a mass transit vehicle, bus or school bus.

Yard waste includes: leaves, garden residue, shrubbery with no dirt attached, limbs, twigs, brush and tree trimmings, and similar items, but does not include grass clippings.



Yard waste must be placed in a bio-degradable paper bag. Tree trimmings not to exceed three inches in diameter; brush, limbs, twigs and shrubbery must be bundled in lengths not to exceed four feet.

2014 GYPSY MOTH REPORT

Gypsy Moth density has increased within the surveyed areas of Shaler Township from an average of four egg masses per acre (EMA) that hatched in the spring 2014 to an average of eight EMA that will hatch in spring 2015.

The risk assessment survey in Kiwanis Park maintains a gypsy moth population of 80 EMA. The egg masses are large and healthy. Each egg mass contains c.a. 500-700 eggs. While the gypsy moth population trend within Shaler Township is on the rise, the abundance of spring and early summer rains assisted the entomophaga maimaiga, gypsy moth fungus, in slowing population growth and preventing defoliation.

A continuation of this management plan was recommended and has continued in the spring of 2015 to reduce the potential of defoliation, tree mortality, and nuisance associated with caterpillars and their excrement. The fungus has been a key factor in the regulation of this pest.
